Childhood cancer

Lions support the **Tori's Angels Foundation.** The Angels raise

funds to support families of children accepted for assistance who have life-threatening medical conditions until his/her 19th birthday. The foundation pays for medical expenses not covered by insurance, including: travel expenses to treatment (airfare or mileage, hotels, meals), copays, deductibles, and prescription medicine that is approved by insurance for use in Iowa for the diagnosed, life-threatening condition.

Diabetes

Lions support Hertko Hollow. Camp Hertko Hollow is

dedicated to improving the lives of children and youth who have diabetes. The goals at camp are Recreation, Education, Regulation and FUN! Campers enjoy the traditional camp activities while learning about living with diabetes. Meeting other youth and counselors who have diabetes is also a great benefit of the experience.

Disaster relief

Lions supported the distribution of food and other materials after

the disastrous flood swept through homes and property from Missouri Valley to Hamburg in 2019.

Lion Cleanup volunteers were on hand in Creston, Winterset, and Norwalk after the devastating EF4 tornado struck there in 2022. A Lion grant was received and distributed to assist the victim of these disasters. En∨ironment

Humanitarian

Lions have many avenues to pursue for community humanitarian

causes that may not fit in one of the other 8 categories. Many of our clubs have held fundraisers and benefits for families or individuals suffering with critical family issues like catastrophic house fires, needing help with medical issues, building a ramp for the elderly, etc.

Hunger

Iowa Lions support the increasing hunger problems in several ways.

Not only do some clubs support their own town's food pantries, but additionally the 9SW District has recently dedicated food pantry support in the Care and Share funds to cover emergency situations.

Vision

Lions support Leader Dogs for the Blind, who provide guide dogs for

the vision impaired.

Lions support the **KidSight Program**, which provides all children from 6 months to 6 years a vision screening test that is reviewed by a professional at the lowa University Medical Center in Iowa City. Over 500,000 Iowa school children have been screened. Over 35,000 of these kids were referred to doctors for a follow-up eye checkup

Lions support the lowa Lions Eye Bank in lowa

City by transporting corneas from deceased donors. Volunteer Lions have driven over 1 million miles across our state to deliver these precious corneas from donor hospital to recipient hospital.

Lions also support **cochlear implants** for those needing financial assistance.

Lions support the **Hearing Aid Bank** located in Allison, Iowa. Lions Clubs collect used hearing aids to be refurbished for clients. Lions also provide financial assistance when needed. Over 150 reconditioned hearing aids are given out each year.

Lions collect **used eye glasses** to be recycled back into the population. Donate your old eye glasses to any Lion in the state and they will find a home.
